AMMAN 2004 Joint INCO-MED Conference Amman, Jordan - June 14 & 15, 2004

This 2-day event will focus on the water problems in the South Mediterranean Region that are still growing rapidly. Research is ongoing everywhere to better understand and combat scarce resources, waste of resources, more efficient irrigation etc.

The Amman 2004 Conference aims at bringing these researchers together and provide an open platform for scientific exchange, discussions with user associations and utilities and for developing new research ideas for the future.

This conference addresses in particular all ongoing and completed INCO-MED projects in the water domain. It is of course open to all other organisations and individual researchers working in this field.

The main topics to be addressed are:

- Management Policies: Comprehensive policy for integrated water planning
- Agriculture: Improving the water consumption by users; plant breeding for efficient water and nutrient use
- Technologies:
 - Compare modern and traditional technologies, and approaches to water savings and sustainable irrigation
 - Advanced water treatment, re-use and energy implications
- Desalination: New techniques based on renewable energies

The first MedAqua INCO-MED Conference took place in Amman, from June 11 to June 13, 2001, held under the Patronage of the Ministry of Water and Irrigation, Jordan. More than 100 participants from 7 South Mediterranean and 8 European countries where present and 42 presentation where given. Abstracts and Presentations and the list of all participants are available on the MedAqua site www.MedAqua.org.

Many new INCO projects are ongoing in the Mediterranean Region in the Framework 5 Programme of the European Commission and more are expected in the new FP 6. 13 projects are dealing with Management Policies, 8 with Agriculture and 10 with water technologies.

Many of these are expected to present their results at the Amman 2004 Conference.

Submission of Papers

Abstracts of 500 words are invited. They should be sent by email to info@medaqua.org, subject "Amman2004". Accepted presentations will be published on the MedAqua web site. Authors can choose two different styles of paper presentation:

Document Style: If the presentation is primarily text-based, with no or few graphics, this is the preferred style. The final paper should not be longer than 10 pages, A4 and 12 pt.

Slide Style: If the presentation contains a large number of graphics, a PowerPoint presentation of up to 12 slides can be submitted. The minimum text size must be 16 pt.
