

Mediterranean Component of the EUWI (MED EUWI)



Objectives – Aims

- Assist the design of better, demand-driven and result-oriented programmes,
- Facilitate better coordination of water programmes and projects, targeting to a more effective use of existing funds and mobilizing new financial resources,
- Foster cooperation for projects' proper implementation, based on enhancing synergies and strategic assessment.

Focus Themes of MED EUWI

- Integrated water resources management (IWRM), with emphasis on planning of national & transboundary bodies;
- Water supply & sanitation,
 with emphasis on the poorest part of the societies;
- Water, food, environment interaction, with emphasis on fragile ecosystems;
- Non-conventional water resources;

and horizontal focus themes:

- Transfer of technology, know-how, training & capacity building;
- Education (MEDIES)

Synergies

The region has a tradition in cooperation and networking

Strong synergies & linkages between related, regional Initiatives and Programmes: important elements to ensure effectiveness and avoid overlaps:



MED EUWI Work Programme 2007

- Continue implementation of Country Dialogues in Egypt & Lebanon (focusing on the link between the reconstruction process and the national water strategy); work on the launching of other National Dialogues
- Continue activities that promote national IWRM institutional settings in North Africa within the Rabat Declaration framework; IWRM Workshop in Libya, 11-12 Apr. 2007, and follow up steps in cooperation with the Libyan General Water Authority for the establishment of a National Water Council and the implementation of institutional reforms in the water sector advocated by the AfDB/AWF
- Organisation of the annual Conference of the Water Directors of the Euro-Mediterranean and South-Eastern European Countries (10-11 Dec. 2007, Slovenia), serving as a stepping stone for the preparation of the "Euro-Mediterranean Ministerial Conference on Water" scheduled for late 2008
- Initiate & realise MED EUWI activities in other countries: Conference on Sustainable Water Resources Management in Palestine, held in Jordan on 27-29 Aug. 2007; targeted training workshop on IWRM in Syria coorganised with GTZ-Syria on 10-13 Sep. 2007

MED EUWI Work Programme 2007 (continued)

- Capacity building workshops and assessments on transboundary water resources management, with emphasis on groundwater, in SE Europe; organisation of a related side event at the 6th EfE Ministerial Conference (Oct. 2007, Belgrade); organisation of a Ministerial Session in the International Roundtable on Integrated Management of Shared Groundwater in SE Europe (Slovenia, 14-16 Nov. 2007)
- Continue support of the 6 Working Groups of the Joint Process MED EUWI / WFD
- Intensify collaboration and linkages with Horizon 2020 and the ENPI;
 Conference on Involving Private Investors in the Horizon 2020
 Initiative (Athens, 22-23 Oct. 2007)
- Intensify collaboration with GEF Strategic Partnership for the Mediterranean Large Marine Ecosystems, UNDP, UNEP MAP, UN ESCWA, NAMCOW, etc
- Continuation of educational activities on water through MEDIES

MED EUWI Work Programme 2007 - National

Country Policy Dialogues launched in Lebanon (2005) & Egypt (2006)

Example: The Country Policy Dialogue in Egypt

- Launched in November 2006, Cairo
- Demand-driven process (MoWRI)
- Increased ownership & active involvement of national stakeholders (MoH, MoEnv, HCWW, EWP, RAED, others)
- Institutional background: Bilateral Protocol Greece-Egypt (June '06), EU-Egypt Agreement on Budget Support for the Water Sector (80m euros)
- → It is expected to complement the 'National Water Resources Plan 2017', the 'National Master Plan for Water and Wastewater', the 'Rural Sanitation Strategy' and other strategic frameworks of Egypt,
- → It is also expected to facilitate coordination of donors in close cooperation with the EC Delegation in Cairo
- → It is implemented in close collaboration with OECD/EAP Task Force that will carry out the financial assessments and strategies based on existing methodologies and e-tools (e.g. the FEASIBLE model),
- → Dialogue's ToRs are prepared and emphasis is data collection within 2007 so as to present baseline scenarios in early 2008.

Linking Research with MED EUWI Activities

STEP 1

Identify existing gaps in the collaboration between DG Research and MED EUWI

- List with research programmes (all disciplines) thematically and geographically covering the Mediterranean region
- Identification of research gaps and priorities in the Mediterranean
- -Enhance synergies and create better links among existing regional networks
- Identify one or two projects (in the area of DSS) as pilot case studies for implementation
- Continue support for data collection and resource assessment research and link it with existing EU databases
